Vedder River Campout 2003: by Bruce R. McMahill

With the "sun-a-shining" straight up in the sky, and the weekend forecast calling for "sunshine, sunshine, sunshine," Bruce and Sandra, Chapter WA-E, rode up toward Mount Vernon Friday afternoon, June 6th, to meet Rodney and Tiena -- on her own 750 cc Virago -- for a fun weekend of camping. The temperature was 90 degrees so we spent the time inside the air-conditioned Inspection/Immigration facility. The camping area is a secure, group site, all grass, and level, heavily treed and large enough for about 150 members. Derrick and Gail brought their Cocker Spaniel – Taboma – who stood guard around us for scraps that might accidentally drop onto the ground. Taboma was something like a live vacuum cleaner. Oh!! 




