Boy have we been busy since the last newsletter - read on!

A little Bite from BCCOM

It was a most interesting meeting, covering a little of everything that is of interest to most men and women who ride for enjoyment. A good place to find the most reliable information.

One of our guest speakers was Mike FitzPatric from Victoria , an insurance agent for Western Union Ins. Underwriters. He talked about multiple coverage for your bike. It's called All-Peril, Collision, Fire, Theft and Storage. If you are in an accident they will arrange to bring you and your bike home, great if you're out of province. If your 1-3 year old bike is stolen they will pay you what you paid for it. Older bikes like mine (1984 Aspencade) should have a declared market price in writing: an estimate from a dealer together with photos.

Another informative speaker was Ron Szoozei from chromedreams.com phone 604 – 307 – 7564. He is a professional bike appraiser. He talked about proper bike declared values, accessory values and fair market value prior to having an accident or damage/loss. He also talked about documentation for insurance policies or bank loans. Also there are: Cash Values, Replacement Values, Declared Values, Collector Bike Values, Agreed Values etc.....I never knew there were so many different kinds! Every owner probably feels different about their own bike depending upon what they have done to it. Professional advice is always good to have so give Ron a call if you need his services.

Adel Tompkins will be talking with Nick Geer ICBC's President, CEO and Chairman of the Board about transferable plates: your most expensive bike with full year coverage for those who have more than one bike to ride (lucky them!). Another interesting topic is the ICBC practice of selling bike insurance to people who don't hold a class 6 licence; something positive must be done to stop this!

Adel will also be asking ICBC to put some money into May Motorcycle Awareness Month for advertising and safety bumper stickers – safety is everyone's concern.

She will also be talking to the Burnaby Engineering Dept. Council to try to change their bylaw so that up to 3 bikes can occupy one car spot for the price of that one car, it would be up to the bike owners to feed the meter. This busy lady is also talking again with Vancouver Council over the "loud pipes" issue and another issue about parking in the West End from 6am to 6pm for people who ride their bikes to work.

Adel Tompkins is spending a lot of time and effort at different companies and bike shops to support the May Awareness month with advertising in the BCCOM newsletter and, if possible, donations which are badly needed. GWRRA Policy Regarding -Conduct of Training & Skill Events, Revised April 23, 2003

We sometimes assume consistent and common safety practices are employed when conducting various GWRRA training and skill events. Based upon information received recently, however, exceptions have occurred.

In the interests of safety, adequate and consistent safety standards must be maintained when conducting National, Region, District, or Chapter motorcycle or trike training and/or skill events for the good of all participants as well as to eliminate unnecessary liability for the Association.

Effective immediately, the following requirements must be adhered to by all participants in GWRRA Region, District and Chapter rider training and skill events. (Including, but not limited to the GWRRA Advanced Rider Course, Trike Rider Course, or Trailering Course; Field Events or Top Gun competitions, Parking Lot Practice sessions or any other MSF, CSC, GWRRA or ESC-sponsored instruction or riding practice.)

Rider Licensing - All Riders must hold a valid driver's license with motorcycle endorsement or, at minimum, a motorcycle operator's learner's permit. Riders who do not hold a valid license will not be permitted to participate.

Proper Riding Attire - All Riders and Co-Riders must wear "proper" riding gear while riding. This will include, at a minimum, a DOT approved helmet, eye protection, full-fingered gloves, over-the-ankle foot protection (boots preferred), with the balance of the body fully covered (leather or abrasion-resistant attire preferred; denim accepted.) Jackets or shirts should be a single piece of apparel and not be modular (i.e., not "riding sleeves").

These requirements shall apply at any GWRRA-sponsored rider education or competitive riding event. They do not apply to any "non-educational" or "non-competitive" riding activity, such as a Chapter ride, parade, fun/poker run, etc.

Please assist us in conveying this message to all GWRRA officers, educators and Members.

SUBJECT: BCCOM - SINGLE PLATE, MULTIPLE

The B.C. Coalition of Motorcyclists (BCCOM) is proud to announce that after several years of lobbying, the Insurance Corporation of British Columbia (ICBC) has agreed to implement transferable plates for motorcyclists, so that if you own more than one bike you will be able to insure the most expensive and swap the plate. There are many details to work out and BCCOM will be working with the Insurance Corporation of B.C. to have this program ready to go in January of 2005. Through meetings with ICBC, it was also acknowledged that riders should not be allowed to purchase insurance for their motorcycle without the primary rider listed producing a class 6 or learners license. As of January 2004, this will be policy.


